Dear Rowland Denny,

This is written in regards to our concerns about the funding strategy proposed for the DRAFT FY16 & FY17 Priority List for the Clean Water Fund (CWF). The Trumbull WPCA would like to stress the importance of continuing the 20% grant/80% loan program for "Collection System Improvement Program" type projects for municipalities like ours. This is strongly recommend so that we can continue to improve our Pump Stations and reduce excess ground water infiltration into the sewer systems.

As you may be aware, the Town of Trumbull WPCA maintains a wastewater collection system. We transport our wastewater flows to the City of Bridgeport for treatment at their West Side WPCF. We have been studying our collection system and have relatively aggressive plans to implement cost effective recommendations to eliminate excess ground water infiltration. The total cost for the projects proposed in the 10-year Capital Plan are approximately \$10,000,000.

Obtaining a 20% Grant on \$10,000,000 has a major savings for small communities like Trumbull. These Grant opportunities allows for the implementation of additional cost effective repairs to reduce excess ground water infiltration into the sewer system.

Effective immediately, in an effort to streamline and expedite the process for issuing encroachment permits, the Connecticut Department of Transportation (Department) has adopted a new policy to issue encroachment permits directly to the Utility Company whether the work is being performed by the Utility Company or its Contractor(s). The Utility Company shall be held totally responsible and liable for all work performed by either Party(ies) within the state right-of-way, including highway restoration to the standards of the Department and compliance to work zone traffic control requirements meeting at a minimum the standards set forth in the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices".

The encroachment permit is required for the performance of test pits during the design phase of a State Highway Project, for utility installations and adjustments to its facilities within the state right-of-way on a State Highway Project and Utility Company Projects (utility work initiated by the Utility Company).

The District Office of Surveys shall provide an encroachment permit along with a State/Utility Test Pit Agreement for test pits to be performed during the design phase of a State Highway Project. The District Office of Construction shall provide an encroachment permit with a Notice to Proceed Letter to the Utility Company for utility work to be performed on a State Highway Project.

For Utility Company Projects, the encroachment permit shall be issued to the Utility Company upon the submittal of a permit application to the District Office of Permits and approval of the permit application by the Department.

Prior to issuing an encroachment permit on a State Highway Project which involves substantial and/or extensive highway restoration, a performance bond shall be required by the Utility Company. The Utility Company shall be responsible to ensure that its contractor(s) working under the Utility's permits are insured to the Department's minimum limits for liability/insurance coverage.


