### Special Trumbull Police Commission Meeting September 11, 2023 MINUTES

The Trumbull Police Commission meeting was called to order at 6:05 p.m. with the recitation of the pledge and moment of silence.

Members present: Raymond G. Baldwin, Jr., Chairman

#### **Public Comment**

There was no one from the public present to speak.

#### **Approval of the July 18, 2023, Police Commission Meeting Minutes**

Motion made by Commissioner Trefz to accept the Police Commission meeting minutes of July 18, 2023, as presented, seconded by Commissioner Fonseca. There was no further discussion. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **Chief's Report**

#### **Correspondence**

Chief Lombardo reviewed the correspondence items listed below.

Letter from Westport Police thanking our department for help with traffic at their fireworks.

Letter from couple thanking Ofc. Yocher for his heroic assistance and professionalism during a medical emergency.

Email from First Selectman Tesoro's office describing positive comments phoned in by resident regarding her contact with Ofc. Pereira, who pulled her over for a motor vehicle violation.

Letter from Tait Road resident praising Ofc. Moramarco's response regarding parking violations.

Letter from Sgt. Gagstetter advising he was ordered to active duty with the U.S. Coast Guard through September 30<sup>th</sup>.

Letter from the organizer of the Sunset Run praising the assistance of Sgt. Fedor and Ofc. Yocher.

Email from Weston Police Capt. Brodacki thanking Ofc. Siljamaki for his assistance in a child pornography investigation being conducted by the multi-town Technical Investigations Unit, SW CT.

Letter from resident whose dog was involved in biting incident, thanking Ofc. McClinch and Animal Control Ofc. Dellabianca for their caring and professionalism.

Letter from Ridgefield Police thanking dive team members, (Sgt. Gagstetter, Sgt. Harry, Ofc. McEnaney, Ofc. Sota, Ofc. Capone, Ofc. Leos and Ofc. Carlson) who helped recover the body of a drowning victim.

### **Operations**

Chief Lombardo reviewed the following reports for the months of July and August: Calls for Service, Criminal Incidents, Motor Vehicle Enforcement, Alarms, Incident Statistics, K-9 Reports, Juvenile Referrals, Arrest Summary, Traffic, Detective Division, Training, Cadet Report, Sick/Injury, and budget.

Chief Lombardo pointed out an increase in thefts from vehicles in the month of August, and noted that in most cases, the vehicles were left unlocked.

Chief Lombardo advised that although July saw a higher than usual number of juvenile arrests (16), there was not an increase in the number of

incidents, as some of July's cases resulted in several juveniles being arrested with regard to a single incident.

Chief Lombardo gave an update on the current status of recruits, noting that the department has one recruit scheduled to graduate from the Bridgeport Police Academy on September 19<sup>th</sup>, and the department's 4 recruits in field training are progressing nicely.

Chief Lombardo stated that during a Police Cadet award ceremony held in Westfield MA, 215 cadets from various area police departments were vying for just 5 awards, and 2 of those were won by Trumbull Police Cadets. Chief Lombardo praised Sgt. Fedor and the Police Cadets.

Chief Lombardo described recruitment efforts recently employed, such as help wanted ads posted on social media. He advised that another idea being considered is posting video clips of officers describing their work experiences.

Commissioner Baldwin stated that he thought the average number of sick days per officer was a bit high at 9.6, and Chief Lombardo explained that the number of long-term absences for two officers was spiking that average. Commissioner Baldwin asked if long-term absences can be reported separately.

Chief noted that spending for overtime continues to be higher than normal due to staff shortages and the summer double time for weekend evening shifts agreement that just ended.

### **New Business**

Motion made by Commissioner Trefz to enter executive session to interview police officer candidate and discuss pension negotiations, seconded by Commissioner Fonseca. There was no further discussion. Motion passed unanimously and Commission entered executive session at 6:26 p.m.

Motion made by Commissioner Baldwin to exit executive session, seconded by Commissioner Trefz. There was no further discussion. Motion passed unanimously and Commission exited executive session at 7:06 p.m.

Motion made by Commissioner Baldwin, seconded by Commissioner Fonseca to make conditional offer of employment effective 9/13/23 to Police Officer Candidate Luis A. Llano Jr. contingent upon satisfactory medical and drug testing results. No further discussion. Motion passed unanimously.

Motion by Commissioner Trefz, seconded by Commissioner Fonseca to adjourn. No further discussion. Motion passed unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 7:08 p.m.

### Special Trumbull Police Commission Meeting

December 12, 2023

### MINUTES

The Trumbull Police Commission meeting was called to order at 5:35 p.m. with the recitation of the pledge and moment of silence in remembrance of deceased police officers and emergency personnel.

#### **Public Comment**

No members of the public were present to speak.

#### **Approval of Minutes**

Approval of the September 11, 2023 minutes—tabled

Motion by Commissioner Trefz, seconded by Vice Chairman Magliocco to approve the October 12, 2023 minutes. Motion passed with one abstention from Commissioner Thornton.

Motion by Vice Chairman Magliocco, seconded by Commissioner Thornton to approve November 14, 2023 minutes. Motion passed with one abstention from Commissioner Trefz.

## **Chief's Report**

### **Correspondence**

Chief Lombardo summarized a letter from a resident thanking Officer Fortunato for her professionalism and kindness while responding to a recent motor vehicle accident.

### **Operations**

Chief Lombardo reviewed the following reports for the month of November: calls for service, criminal incidents, motor vehicle enforcement, alarms, incident statistics, school resource, K-9, juvenile referrals, arrest summary, traffic, detective division, training, cadet report, sick/injury, personnel count, and budget.

Chief Lombardo stated that larcenies from cars are still an issue, and police ask that people lock their cars and remove valuables.

Chief Lombardo expressed his hope to restore SRO positions in the future when the department has an adequate number of officers.

Chief Lombardo mentioned recent incidents of phone scams where residents have lost money. He directed the Detective Division to visit banks in town to ensure they are on the lookout for possible victims of these scams. He warned that residents should not fall for these scams. Commissioner Trefz commented that businesses are also falling victim to phone scams.

Chief Lombardo noted that Sgt. Fedor was chosen to be a member of the Connecticut Police Officer Standards and Training Council's Hate Crime Task Force to develop police training curriculum regarding hate crimes.

Chief Lombardo said that police conducted compliance checks at liquor stores in town.

Chief Lombardo advised that Capt. Lopes will be addressing the high number of sick absences.

Chief Lombardo said overtime spending is expected to be over budget by approximately \$400,000.00, but it will hopefully be balanced using money from the salary account.

**New Business**

There was a short discussion of the possible removal of the flashing traffic light at Main Street and Ridgeview Avenue.

Motion by Vice Chairman Magliocco, seconded by Commissioner Thornton to ask the State of Connecticut to remove the light at their expense. Motion passed unanimously.

**Executive Session**

Motion by Chairman Baldwin, seconded by Vice Chairman Magliocco to enter executive session for the purpose of interviewing one police officer candidate. Motion passed unanimously and the Commission entered executive session at 5:56 p.m.

Motion by Chairman Baldwin, seconded by Vice Chairman Magliocco to come out of executive session. Motion passed unanimously, and the Commission came out of executive session at 6:10 p.m.

Motion by Chairman Baldwin, seconded by Commissioner Trefz to make a conditional offer of employment to Joseph Dzurenda (hire date of 12/19/2023), subject to a successful medical exam and successful completion of the Cooper's Standard physical agility test with a score in the 40<sup>th</sup> percentile or higher before the end of his probation period. No further discussion, motion passed unanimously.

**Presentation**

Chief Lombardo made a presentation of a plaque to Commissioner Thornton, as she will be moving out of state and will no longer serve on the Commission. Chief Lombardo, A/C Byrnes, and each Commissioner thanked Commissioner Thornton for her service on the Board. Sgt. Coppola, on behalf of the Police Union and the Police Benevolent Society thanked Commissioner Thornton for her service and presented her with a gift.

**Adjournment**

Motion to adjourn by Commissioner Thornton, seconded by Vice Chairman Magliocco. Motion passed unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 6:20 p.m.

#### **Details:**

- Task Force Officers received information that a convicted felon would be traveling with multiple firearms. The suspect vehicle was stopped and both occupants were arrested. Officers recovered four (4) handguns (1 was stolen and 1 ghost gun), high-capacity magazines, ammunition, and cocaine – **4 GUNS recovered.**
- Task Force Officers recovered two (2) stolen vehicles, one stolen mv had a firearm inside which was NOT recovered. Officers were able to apprehend five (5) known juveniles and charge them for the stolen vehicles.
- Task Force Officers recovered two (2) stolen vehicles and arrested three (3) juveniles.
- Task Force Officers stopped a vehicle that had been involved in drug sales. One male fled and tossed a gun nearby. Another firearm with a 50-round magazine, heroin/fentanyl and cocaine was recovered from the vehicle as the two occupants were arrested. An arrest warrant for the fleeing male has been obtained – **2 GUNS recovered.**

### Details:

- Task Force Officers stopped a vehicle where the operator was a convicted felon and had a 9mm "Ghost Gun" with a high-capacity magazine, and marijuana packaged for street sale in his possession. He was charged accordingly – **1 Ghost GUN recovered.**
- Task force Officers served search warrants and located cocaine, promethazine, and a 9mm GLOCK handgun. The male suspect was charged accordingly, and his girlfriend was arrested for outstanding warrants – **1 GUN recovered.**
- Task Force Officers served a search warrant where crack cocaine and heroin packaged for sale were recovered. Suspect was arrested.
- Task Force Officers observed a drug transaction and arrested the dealer for possession crack cocaine and having an outstanding warrant for **Failure to Register as a Sex Offender.**
- Task Force Officers served a search warrant and located a suspect in possession of a 9mm handgun, and two (2) AR style rifles, along with marijuana and packaging material were located. The suspect was charged – **3 GUNS were recovered.**
- Task Force Officers assisted FBI JTTF with online threats that were religiously and racially motivated. An arrest warrant was served on the JV suspect.

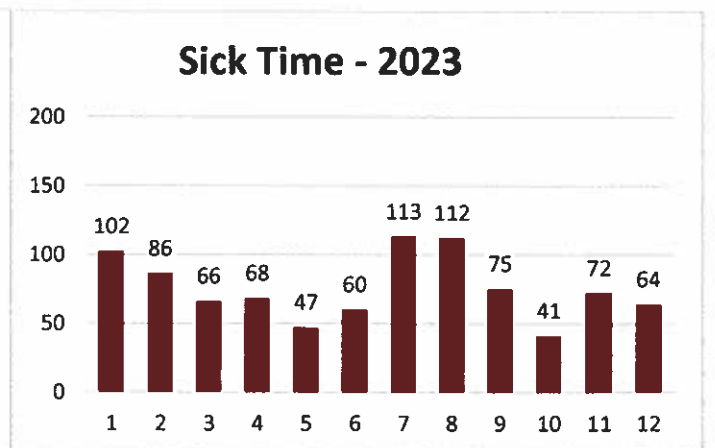
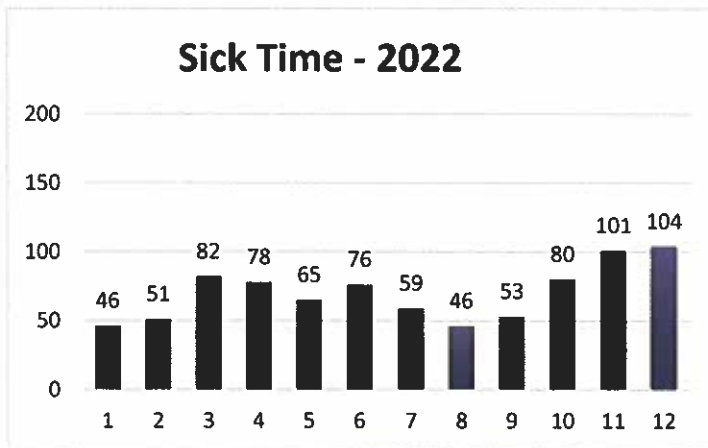
