MINUTES  
JANUARY 7, 2021

**CALL TO ORDER:** The Acting Chair called the virtual meeting to order at 7:33 p.m. All present joined in a moment of silence and the Pledge of Allegiance. First Selectman Tesoro stated the episode in Washington D.C. yesterday where the symbol of our democracy, the Capital building was desecrated by an unruly mob was both unsettling and an opportunity. It's unsettling because it's an extreme example of the division in our nation and that a the extent of a small number of people will put their personal point of view ahead of the greater good. Like all Americans of good will, we in Trumbull know violence is never justified. We know the symbols of our democracy act as a unifying force no matter our political persuasion or our point of view. An attack on these symbols no matter who does it is an attack on all of us. This is also an opportunity to step back and think rationally about what our politics should be. Character assassination, questioning people's motives and incivility should have no place in our politics. Unfortunately, that has not been the case and needs to stop. Let us all recommit to respecting one another's point of view. Disagreeing civilly and making arguments that are fact based. When our point of view wins, we should be gracious winners. When our point of view does not win, we should be both gracious and committed to doing better. If we do that, we can use the awful situation of yesterday to make a better tomorrow.

The Acting Chair asked all those present to remember Steven Wright who recently passed away. He was the former BOE Chairman, he served as chairman from 2003-2013 and also served on the State BOE for ten years, Joseph Schlig a former BOF member who passed away at the age of 93 in December and to remember all those suffering from COVID and that we have calm during the transition at the Capital.

DISCUSSION ITEM: Police Station Building Committee Update

Angelo Magglio Chairman of the Police Station Building Committee was present and indicated he has served for 5 years as both Chairman and Vice-Chairman, he replaced Lisa Labella. The project is not completed to date but is very close. He gave a brief history of how the project came to be for the new council members. COVID-19 slowed the committee's progress. All punch-list items have been completed. They are awaiting the fence that will shield the neighbors' view of the ventilation system. They are waiting for the materials. The project is under budget and hopes the next time he is before the council he will be able to say the project is complete. Assistant Chief Byrnes and the committee worked with the town's Finance Department. They have the change-order percentages. The percentages could be forwarded to the council. All of the work at TPD has been well received by the officers. There had been no updates to the building for 40 years. He extended his gratitude to the Director of Public Works for all of his input.

Committee Report: The Finance Committee met on January 4, 2021 and voted unanimously.

Moved by Marsh, seconded by Glasser-Orenstein to waive the full reading of the committee meeting minutes. VOTE: Motion CARRIED by unanimous consent.

Ms. Pires explained this isn't bonding, the bond authorization would be at next month's BOF meeting and then to the town council, they don't bond until the project is completed. The \$10 million approved in August would be notes first and will bond next year after the project is completed.

Mr. Estrada made the following recommendations for the 5-Year Plan:

- A line item for the BOE Long Hill Administration Building at \$30,000 on the town side for the evaluation of the roof and HVAC system. What is there now is beyond its useful life. They are doing something similar at the Town Hall and are currently preparing bids. A professional assessment is needed to be able to bid; he doesn't see a new building in the near future.

- Transfer Station, (page 17 of the plan) roof replacement at \$140,000 be moved to the year 2022, he wants to bring more accurate information.
- Daniels Farm Road & White Plains Road Intersection Improvements. The new development has been very successful and has impacted traffic. The First Selectman asked that they look into grants. There is a federal transportation grant at \$2 million - \$3 million. He asked for \$500,000 as a placeholder in 2021, the grant will require a 20%-25% match. Including this in the plan would allow them to move forward with MetroCog on the grant. Signalization, crosswalks and signage, change in grade and possibly que lanes will be looked at. They have been in discussions with the state for several months on signalization. Ms. Bakalar explained the lights are old and need a complete replacement. The landlord has changed the configuration of the parking lot and has been very helpful. It's critical to have this in the plan.
- Program for digitalizing documents at Town Hall. This could never happen soon enough, storage areas have been maxed out. He suggested \$100,000 in the year 2021. This could be done with the assistance of MetroCog and the cloud. Mr. Scinto suggested the town's own storage not the cloud. The Council discussed and Ms. Pires confirmed this was an operating expense not a bonded expense. Mr. Estrada withdrew his request.

The Council discussed the BOE school roof items. Mr. Morello explained they met with an expert on the three roofs, Middlebrooks, Booth and Jane Ryan. Booth Hill's roof is 30 years old and is showing its age, Middlebrooks is the worst and would need a whole new roof. Mr. Hendrickson wanted to revise the cost estimates based on the expert's recommendations. The Town Council and Town Attorney discussed the fact that BOE had already voted on the 5-Year Plan. Town Attorney Schopick suggested leaving the BOE amounts as is. First Selectman Tesoro read the minutes of the BOE meeting. Mr. Shively noted one other discrepancy, the Bus Garage is \$65,000 but the BOE voted on the \$30,000 number. The Jane Ryan school roof was done in 2010 therefore it could be pushed out to an another year. Mr. Morello confirmed. It was confirmed they would leave the BOE amounts as is in the plan.

Ms. Isaac questioned whether the Daniels Farm School asbestos included in a previous year's plan, (2019) had been completed. Ms. Pires will check last year's bond authorization resolution.

The Council summarized the additions and/or changes to the plan as:

- \$30,000 for the Long Hill Administration Building HVAC/Roof Evaluation
- Economic Development/\$500,000 for the Daniels Farm Road & White Plains Road Intersection Signalization/Intersection Improvements
- Move the Jane Ryan Roof to another year, (2022)
- Transfer Station item at \$140,000 moved to 2022

Ms. Pires noted the \$7 million for the Hardy property were notes only.

The following amendments were made to 5-Year Plan.

## FULL RESOLUTION

### RESOLUTION TC28-132:

Whereas, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) provides funding to the State of Connecticut Department of Housing under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Small Cities Covid-19 Program for grants to towns of less than 50,000 in population; and,

Whereas, funds are to be used to prevent, prepare and respond to the coronavirus pandemic; and,

Whereas, the Town of Trumbull with the guidance of the Long Term Recovery Committee, submitted a letter of application for \$100,000 for a “Local Meals” program; and,

Whereas, the Local Meals program will utilize Trumbull restaurants and eateries to provide nutritious meals to vulnerable populations and quarantined individuals and families to reduce their risk of exposure and exposing others; and,

Whereas, the program will support Trumbull businesses by bringing additional commerce to those businesses during this difficult time; and,

Whereas, the Department of Economic and Community Development, the Department of Social Services and the Finance department will work together to implement the program and administer grant funds.

NOW THEREFORE, Be it Resolved, that the Trumbull Town Council acknowledges the submission of the letter of application to the Connecticut Department of Housing and subsequently accepts the CDBG, Small Cities Covid-19 funding in the amount of \$100,000. The Trumbull Town Council identifies Vicki A. Tesoro, First Selectman, as the individual authorized to sign the application, Assistance Agreement and all subsequent amendments, reports and related documents in order to administer and implement the project.

TC28-141—AMENDMENT TO TOWN COUNCIL RULES OF PROCEDURE:

4. NOTICE OF MEETINGS:

Notice of all Council meetings shall be published in a newspaper having general circulation within the Town not less than 5 calendar days or more than 10 calendar days prior to the meeting, said notice shall contain the time, date and place where such meeting shall be held. A copy of said notice shall be filed with the Town Clerk and posted on the Town's website along with available supplemental materials in accordance with the Town of Trumbull Charter, as revised. Notice of meetings and agenda shall be distributed to each Council member not less than 6 calendar days prior to the meeting. Council members will receive all agendas, materials and minutes, via electronic mail. Delivery by U.S. Postal service will be considered supplemental except as otherwise required by law. Bulk documents will not be sent by electronic or U.S. mail except where said material is provided to the Town Council in electronic format. Said material will be made available in Town Hall with notification to Council members.
