### Special Trumbull Police Commission Meeting January 8, 2024 MINUTES

The Trumbull Police Commission meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. with the recitation of the pledge and moment of silence in remembrance of deceased police officers and emergency personnel.

#### **Public Comment**

No members of the public were present to speak.

#### **Chief's Report**

#### **Correspondence**

Chief Lombardo summarized an email from a resident thanking Officer Carlson and K9 Rico for visiting her child's Cub Scout group.

#### **Operations**

Chief Lombardo reviewed the following reports for the month of December: calls for service, criminal incidents, motor vehicle enforcement, alarms, incident statistics, school resource, K-9, juvenile referrals, arrest summary, traffic, detective division, training, cadet report, sick/injury, personnel count, and budget.

Chief Lombardo noted that building checks on the midnight shift are included in the total number of incidents.

There was a short discussion regarding recovered guns/weapons.

Chief Lombardo mentioned plans for Captain Lopes to meet with officers who are out sick frequently.

There was a short discussion of the personnel count report.

Chief Lombardo noted that overtime spending continues to be high, and he expects the amount to reach approximately \$1.5 million by the end of the fiscal year.

A plan to add Dodge Durangos to the fleet was discussed.

Assistant Chief Byrnes reviewed a draft of next year's budget proposal. He noted a 6.4% increase in the salary line due to a 3.25% contracted salary increase for officers, hiring incentive payments to be made to lateral transfers, and one new full-time social worker position.

Assistant Chief Byrnes then reviewed plans for other major purchases in next year's budget proposal such as vehicles, locks, cameras, and optic sights for handguns. A discussion ensued regarding the importance of having the budget proposal approved, especially for the purchase of vehicles. It was mentioned that proposals in previous years were reduced by Town officials.

### **Old Business**

Chief Lombardo said that the reinstatement of the pension plan has been approved and the Town is working with an attorney to have the necessary documents written. Chief Lombardo does not have a firm timeline on this yet.

### **Approval of Minutes**

Motion by Commissioner Trefz, seconded by Commissioner Fonseca to approve the September 11, 2023 minutes. Motion passed with one abstention from Vice Chairman Magliocco.

Motion by Vice Chairman Magliocco, seconded by Commissioner Trefz to approve December 12, 2023 minutes. Motion passed with one abstention from Commissioner Fonseca.

### **Adjournment**

Motion to adjourn by Vice Chairman Magliocco, seconded by Commissioner Trefz. Motion passed unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 6:20 p.m.
